

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



According to the population estimate at 31.12.2023, the Republic of North Macedonia has 1826247 inhabitants, which is 99036 persons or 5.1% less compared to the population estimates in 2013, and 67555 persons or 3.6% less compared to 2018.

Regarding the age structure, the Macedonian population is increasingly ageing. In the period 2013-2023, the share of the old population (age group 65 and over) grew from 13.1% to 18.1%.

During the period 2013-2023, the number of live births decreased by 6041, and the birth rate decreased from 12.0% to 9.2% (live births per 1000 population) in 2023.

The changes in the age structure are reflected in the number of deaths in the country. The constant increase in the number of deaths caused an increase in the mortality rate to 11.1% in 2023, compared to 2013 when it was 10.0% (deaths per 1000 population).

Compared to 2013, the number of marriages in 2023 decreased by 9.4%, while the number of divorces decreased by 13.7%.



Deaths by causes of death in 2023 - structure (%)¹⁾

Most deaths, by (ICD-IX), were due to circulatory diseases (I00-I99), making up 43.8% of the total number of deaths, followed by neoplasms (C00-D48) with 18.6%, deaths due to endocrine, nutritional and metabolic diseases (E00-E90) with 7.2%, deaths due to respiratory system diseases (J00-J99) with 4.7%, and other causes of death with lower participation.

In the 2022/2023 season, the number of performances at professional theatres decreased by 1%, while attendance increased by 27% compared to 2021/2022.



Of the total number of convicted adult perpetrators, most were perpetrators convicted of aggravated thefts and crimes against traffic safety.

In 2023, the number of perpetrators of crimes against traffic safety increased by 27.8% compared to 2018. Over the same period, the number of perpetrators of the crime of aggravated theft increased by 3.3%.


The situation in the field of education does not differ depending on the level of education.

Over the years, there has been a decrease in the number of school entrants in primary and lower secondary education, as well as in the total number of students.

The number of enrolled students in primary and lower secondary education in the school year 2023/2024 was lower by 4.8% compared with 2013/2014.

The number of enrolled students in upper secondary education has decreased as well, and in 2023/2024, compared with 2013/2014, it was lower by 22%.

In tertiary education, the number of students enrolled in 2023/2024 was lower by 9.4% in comparison with 2013/2014.


Agriculture, forestry and fishing had a share in the structure of GDP of 7.1% in 2021 and 7.4% in 2022.











Employed persons by age groups, 2023


Unemployed persons by age groups, 2023



Average monthly net wage in 2023, by quarters












The largest contributor to the total value of completed construction works on structures in the public sector, built by business entities, is transport infrastructure (26.3% in 2013, 46.6% in 2018 and 41.8% in 2023), followed by reconstruction, recovery, adaptation, capital repairs and current maintenance works on constructions (18.4% in 2013, 20.7% in 2018 and 37.5% in 2023), pipelines, communication and electricity lines (3.5% in 2013, 15.7% in 2018 and 11.0% in 2023).

In 2013, 2018 and 2023, dwellings with 3 rooms were built the most, their share in the total number of completed dwellings by years ranging between 35.6% in 2013, 32.2% in 2018 and 36.5% in 2023, followed by 2-room dwellings with 27.9% in 2013, 31.8% in 2018 and 26.9% in 2023.

In 2021, 2022 and 2023, most building permits were issued for buildings (60.0% in 2021, 50.9% in 2022 and 49.7% in 2023) and for reconstructions (28.2% in 2021, 28.2% in 2022 and 20.3% in 2023); consequently, the expected value of the buildings has the highest share (68.5% in 2021, 51.9% in 2021 and 48.7% in 2023), followed by civil engineering works (23.3% in 2021, 40.7% in 2022 and 45.6% in 2023).








The most significant countries by trade volume, 2023¹⁾

Imports according to SITC sectors







Fixed broadband internet connection in enterprises with 10 or more employees (%)







The total number of tourists in 2023 was 1 168 730, of which 37.2% were domestic tourists and the other 62.8% were foreign tourists. Compared to the previous year, the number of foreign tourists increased by 36.6%.

The number of nights spent in 2023 was 3 135 767, of which 55.1% by domestic and the other 44.9% by foreign tourists. Compared to the previous year, the number of nights spent by foreign tourists increased by 22.9%.

¹⁾With respect to the alignment with the new European business statistics regulation (EBS), Regulation (EU) 2019/2152, and the harmonisation of the methodology for maintaining statistical units in the national Statistical Business Register (SBR), kept by the State Statistical Office of the Republic of North Macedonia, the data for the reference year 2021 have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the new EBS Regulation as well as Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2020/1197.

For the first time, the SSO is publishing data on active enterprises (business entities), including complex enterprises that contain two or more legal units. The variables for the statistical units: enterprise, complex enterprise, local unit, and kind of activity unit have been updated in a way that enables a more precise definition of the economic activity status of the statistical unit in the reference year 2021.

Due to these methodological improvements, it will not be possible to compare previously disseminated yearly data from the Statistical Business Register with the current published data for 2021. The published preliminary data on active business entities (enterprises) for 2021 were the last to be produced according to the old methodology.

According to the preliminary data of the State Statistical Office, the number of active enterprises in the Republic of North Macedonia in 2022 was 71 228.


The data on the structure of active enterprises by sections of activities show that the section with the highest share in the structure in 2022 was Wholesale and retail trade; repair of motor vehicles and motorcycles with 30.4%.

The data on the structure of active enterprises according to the number of persons employed show that the highest share of 84.2% belongs to enterprises with 1-9 persons employed, followed by enterprises with no persons employed and enterprises with unascertained number of persons employed (no data on persons employed) with 5.9%, and enterprises with 10-19 persons employed with 4.6%. The share of enterprises with 20-49 persons employed was 3.0%, those with 50-249 persons employed participated with 2.0%, while enterprises with 250 or more persons employed had a share of only 0.3%.
